MAIN THING

The Adventure Never Happens for Those Who Are Comfortable With Spiritual Compromise

SCRIPTURE

Psalm 86:11, Romans 2:21-24,

ICEBREAKER

Has there ever been a time where you compromised in order to achieve something? How did that work out? How did you feel about that accomplishment afterwards?

OPENING THOUGHT

The definition of integrity is, “The state of being whole and undivided.” It is where we get the term “integer (whole number)” from. People comfortable with spiritual compromise, or who live spiritually compromised lives, will never experience the great spiritual adventure God is calling us to. Living in this compromised, lukewarm existence is detrimental for three reasons. One, it destroys you personally. Two, it destroys your witness to your family. Three, it makes the church, and Christians in general, a subject of mockery and ridicule to the unbelieving world. Jesus is calling us to have an undivided heart, to choose Him over the world, and to stop living in this watered-down, compromised, worldly way that dishonors Him and kills our souls.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What was one thing that stood out to you from this weekend's message?
2. As a group, give a definition for integrity. Why is integrity so important in the daily life of a believer? How does Psalm 86:11 relate to that?
3. Read Romans 2:21-24.. It's fairly obvious that God is not a fan of wishy washy people. Why is this such a big deal? How does this affect your witness? How can this affect the way people see God?

LIFE APPLICATION

Integrity, most times, is all about who you are when no one else is around. When you are alone, late at night, what are you partaking in? What are you watching on the TV? What websites are you visiting? What conversations are you having in message apps? As we've already seen in this study, God doesn't want us living dual lives. He wants consistency. What areas are you inconsistent in? Where can you improve? Are there things that need to be removed from your daily life?

CHALLENGE

Many times, it's the people we are most comfortable with that we also get into the most trouble with. Do your group times resemble something that would put a smile on God's face, or do they resemble a frat party? What is the language of your group like? What things do you partake in? Holiness is a big part of integrity, and, as a group, always do your best to maintain holiness within your meetings.
